The chain of events that led to Alcoholics Anonymous may well have begun with the psychiatrist Dr Carl Jung In the early 1930s, Rowland H, an alcoholic desperate to stop drinking, turned to Jung for help He tried repeatedly, but unsuccessfully, to sober up, and Dr Jung finally told him that his condition was
